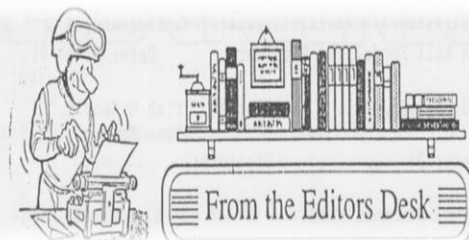

The AGM is around the corner. All positions will be declared vacant so you should have a think about whether you would like to stand for election or if you want to nominate someone for a position.



Nominees should be at the AGM as the nominee has to accept nomination! The nominee also requires a seconder to stand for election. So, you will need to be organised before the meeting, tee up your candidates and ensure there is a seconder. Remember you can nominate yourself if you want to have a go. A number of the incumbents will be retiring so don't rely on them stepping up again. The best training is on the job, but there has always been a strong tradition of helping members who take a job on for the first time.

It is also a time to consider any changes that you would like to make to the way the Club is run. You can put forward your ideas as a motion, if possible, these motions should be emailed to the Secretary (address on the front of the magazine) so that they can be printed out for the meeting.



Alternately you can give "Notice of Motion" by raising the issue at the July meeting, so that it is included in the minutes and can be referred to at the AGM.

Coffs Harbour & District Motorcycle Restorers Club

The Coffs Harbour & District Motorcycle Restorers' Club was formed in 1982 by a small group of motorcycle enthusiasts interested in the preservation of motorcycling history through the maintenance and restoration of older motorcycles.

The aim was not just to have them as museum pieces, but to use them regularly on club rides, at rallies for historic vehicles and even as daily transport.

This is still the club's aim and a program of rides each month is designed to facilitate this.

Your bike doesn't have to gleam with glossy paint and fresh plating or be 'correct' in every detail. This is just the way that some people like their bikes. For other enthusiasts, a bike that looks like it has just been rescued from a dusty chook-shed is 'just right', and so it is too! Whatever approach is your 'cup of tea', you are welcome at our club.

In fact, you don't need to own a motorcycle at all to join the Coffs Harbour & District Motorcycle Restorers' Club, just the interest and enthusiasm of being around old bikes and talking about them is qualification enough.

There is a library of books, videos and DVDs on a wide range of topics, and a variety of workshop manuals available to members.

For motorcycles 30 years and older there is an historic vehicle registration scheme available through the Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) to members of the club. This permits the use of these machines on public roads for published club rides, historic vehicle rallies and for necessary maintenance and repair requirements at a much-reduced rate than full registration. Of course, your bike must be in keeping with the era it was made (not highly modified) and be compliant with the RTA's requirements that govern the historic vehicle registration scheme.

It is easy to become a member....just come along to one of our monthly meetings.

2024 Rally Report

Coffs Harbour 40th Anniversary “Restore and Ride” Rally

Tuesday, 21st May to Sunday, 26th May, based at Sawtell Caravan Park.

A week-long rally and a week of sunshine. The gods of motorcycling were in their heavens and so they should have been with over a hundred entrants, a fine selection of bikes and a crowd brimming with “bon homme” and enthusiasm. Being the 40th Anniversary Rally, the format was extended for a week with a major bike raffle, some special events and rides as well as the usually rally format.

The Rally started on a sunny Tuesday 21st May, with a ride to the Mylestom General Store for a combined morning tea for entrants and Club members with about 60 gathering for the light morning tea. Then about 35 riders girded their loins for the twisty ride up to Dorrigo’s Heritage Hotel for lunch. The ride took in a halt at the spectacular Griffiths’ Lookout for a vista of the mountains and the coast down to South-West Rocks and then supplemented by a quick visit to Dangar Falls.

Thursday was the start of the fun stuff. An early start for some Wollongong and Singleton riders saw a spirited dash of over 200kms out through Dorrigo to Tyringham and returning via the Waterfall Way to the Butter Factory at Bellingen.

The rest of the rally had taken a more leisurely approach and had ridden up from Sawtell Caravan Park to the Butter Factory at around 9.30am for brunch. Then a steady return to the Sawtell Caravan Park to get ready for the Barefoot Bowls challenge. There were 48 people registered to take part in the bowls, however, a handful turned up for the game. All enjoyed a great laugh and some chocolates awarded for the "special" bowls. The Sawtell Bowling Club put on some platters during the bowling trophy presentation and a sizeable number stayed to have dinner.

Friday was a bit of a later start with entrants enjoying the free morning tea provided by the Club as a prelude to the Poker Run. After a riders' briefing, the card dealers and marshals headed out ready for the riders to come through. After the first card was dealt at the Caravan Park, the participants headed for their next card at Sealy Lookout, where riders had a short break to enjoy the view of Coffs on a bright blue sunny day. The ride then proceeded to Sandy Beach for a tasty lunch, collecting their third and fourth card enroute. After a good break, entrants headed back to the Sawtell Caravan Park for their fifth and final card. The Poker Run was won by Paul Gane – with what seems to be an unlikely winning hand of three of a kind – three sixes! Paul scored well for his efforts with a winning trophy, some tickets to the bike raffle and a heap of cash!

A swap meet was also set up on the grass area with a wide variety of items for sale. Though small, the swap meet did a brisk trade and one stall holder reckoned he had done better in two hours than at some major swap meets! The official "welcome BBQ" followed for entrants, and those Coffs' Club members who had assisted with marshalling. It was a great night with the revellers packing the camp kitchen to capacity, while some local wildlife (Possums) also attended to pick up a few scraps.

Saturday's ride was very well attended exceeding all expectations, with late entries, visitors, and lots of Coffs' member. A huge morning tea was supplied by Nambucca Phoenix Disability Services and held in COLA at Bowraville Central School. The COLA was packed with bikes and participants and some of the local Bowra community dropped by to view the impromptu show. Then some entrants elected to visit the adjacent and very interesting Frank Partridge VC Military Museum before rejoining the rest of the morning tea crowd and heading on to Taylors Arm to "The Pub With No Beer". The bikes were lined up in their categories for judging and some founding members of the Coffs Restorers', including Donny Sonter and Allan Smith performed the honours of judging the best bikes for each category. After lunch, riders headed back to Sawtell at their own pace to get ready for the presentation dinner.

Gathering at Sawtell RSL Club for the presentation dinner, were 113 guests who were welcomed by a free beverage on entry. The presentation started as dinner was being served, with some raffle prizes, lucky door prizes, trivia questions and finally the category prize winners.

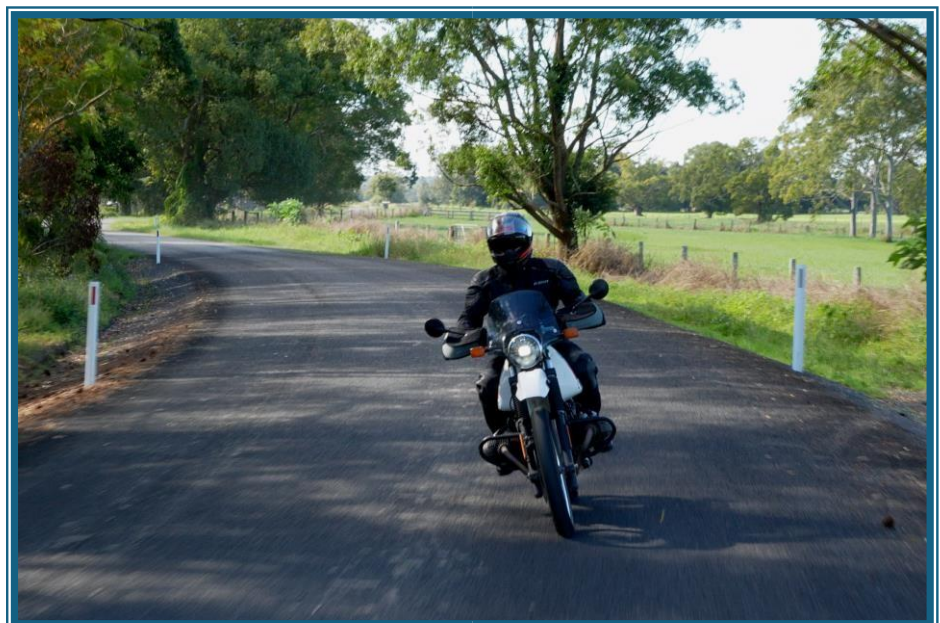

Vintage motorcycle raffled in support of Westpac chopper

TRUE to their name, the Coffs Harbour and District Motorcycle Restorers Club has tackled and triumphed over the restoration of a Suzuki GSX750E 1982 model motorbike, which will now be raffled in support of the

Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service.

At \$10 a ticket the raffle has got the members sweat-soaked, eager for ownership of the treasure.

It's also attracting strong interest from motorcycle enthusiasts in the broader community.

Raffling the vintage Suzuki is just one high point in the local Motorcycle Restorers Club's celebratory 40th 'Restore and Ride Rally' taking place in Savelburg from Tuesday 21 to Sunday 26 May 2024.

"The presentation dinner on the Saturday night will see the grand draw for the Suzuki, proceeds for which will go to the Westpac Rescue Helicopter," club spokesperson Rob Popplewell told News Of The Area.

It's quite a 'prize' say the organisers with very smiles, implying there were some trying times restoring the beauty back to its former glory.

"The bike needed a fair bit of TLC," said Rob. President Nigel Locke cheered the work with "quite a few of us going along to help," said fellow member Mick Carpenter.

While the former owner had let it go cosmetically, Rob said the bike was "fairly good" mechanically, with a few "minor problems".

Following a test ride, Nigel indicated that he would very much like to see the bike



in his garage as a permanent fixture.

"It will be very exciting for whoever wins it," said Mick.

"We're all really proud of this achievement and have enjoyed the sense of purpose it gave us."

With abounding good-hearted camaraderie, the club members are on a high

as they head into their 40th Rally week.

Home for the six-day event is Big 4 Savelburg Holiday Park, where restored bikes 30-years or older are welcome, along with their trusty owners.

Here members will set up swap and sell meets and numerous ride-out events will depart from the park.

Rob Popplewell and Mick Carpenter were among those who helped restore the vintage motorbike.

A varied program of routes throughout the week will take members out to Mylestom, Dorrigo, Nana Glen, Bellingen, Brunner Lookout, Bowraville and more.

Social events will see members barbecuing, competing in barrelfoot bowls, gathering on the beach and sampling local cafes.

While riding home on Sunday afternoon from Club-Week and our 40th Restore & Ride Rally I was happy; brimming over with respect for all of those members over all those years that have made our club function, progress, develop and possible at all.

All the committee members, the captains, vice-captains and machine examiners, the marshals and the cooks; the weekly ride routes and insurance forms, the club plates and the club magazine. All these things and many many more have been cobbled together over the past nearly half-century, to support and maintain this amazing and wonderful old & new motorcycle club.

Hats off to the rally committee for the weather this year. How did they do that? I was thinking we would all be wet and freezing but no, the weather was just PERFECT !!

As for the rides? They too were PERFECT, especially that run to Taylors Arm via Bowraville. The best bit for me was getting accidentally routed almost back to Bowraville on a long and winding road with many bridges and plenty of dirt to add a little edge to the run. When I realised, I had ended up nearly back to Bowraville, I wrapped it on and got quickly back to Macksville, just in time to pull in about 50 metres behind a lovely Triumph Trophy with one of our chefs riding it. We were both running a little late, so I had great fun slowly closing the distance between us, all the way to *The Pub With No Beer*. A great ride, thanks for that Shane, it was a top run.

Because I was dragging a camera and tripod around, when I got to the pub, I drove inside the yard to park near the stage. But maybe I should have stayed out on the road, because I could see a flash of discontent from the eyes of our esteemed judge as he got an eyeful of my dirty, unpolished and scratched-up old GS-1000. I joked with him that the winner had just arrived, but he didn't see the funny in it, and walked right past me and my bike. After that while filming from the pub veranda, I realised that all the bikes inside the gate were just stunning, and all contenders for the royal nod. I'll not make the same mistake again. (Sorry)

From the very beginning of Club Week, it was clear there were interstate and other long-range visitors already in town for our 40th revelries. All of them were so very pleased to see the sun, old friends and some of their favourite rides. And though there were only a few bikes on the Tuesday run to Dorriggo, they were largely old or rare outstanding machines that took advantage of the bright Dorriggo sun to shine their way through the day. The ride to Ulong the next day via Nanna Glen was an Ace!! We got some very nice movies on that Wednesday, and that one beer at Ulong was very nice too.

Also, and but not only were the rally rides the tops, the raffle prize of a GSX-850 Suzuki was mind-blowing. I know that is true because on the night of the rally dinner I talked to the winner, and his mind was totally blown. He had bought only one ticket, came to the rally dinner alone, didn't eat, just sat up the back quietly drinking beer on his own. Then he won it. Truly fantastic! With proceeds of the raffle going to Westpac Helicopter Rescue Service, this is an activity our club could and possibly should, run every year.

So, hats off! Hats off to all of our hardworking club organisers over the past 40 years. And thanks to all of our friendly, willing and helpful members, who share their knowledge and skills among and throughout the club's membership. That's what attracted me over twenty years ago to CH&DMRC, the friendliness and helpfulness of our membership. The enthusiasm for truly beautiful old machines also did much to get me in, but it was the good vibes shared, that I liked best.

LOGBOOK You must always carry your Logbook and Membership Card when riding/driving your club bike/car.

Your logbook does not need to be filled out when you are going on a club calendar ride. But you need to follow that route listed on the ride calendar leaving from your home address and returning in the direction of your home address and make sure your bike has been registered for the day by one of our Captains.

When to fill in your Logbook. You must record return journeys that are not part of club-organised events and each day of maintenance and personal use in the logbook.

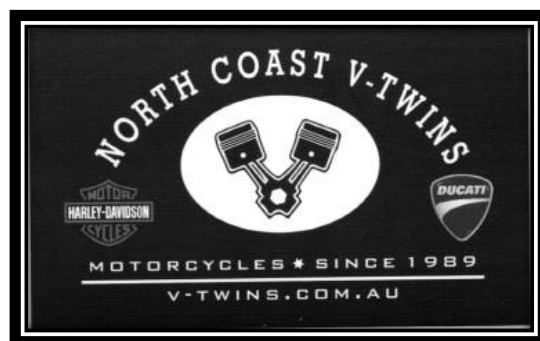
CLUB RALLY Our Club Rally is held Annually in late May.

Membership renewal.

The end of the club's financial year is 30th June

Your membership expired on that date. This means you cannot ride a conditionally registered bike after the 30th June unless you have paid your membership subscription.

As far as the RMS is concerned, if the owner of the vehicle is not financial with his club, then the bike is unregistered, irrespective of when the bike's registration runs out.



MEMBERS SECTION

Members are required to attend at least three events during a membership year and can be by way of attending a Club meeting, ride days, the rally, Club Christmas party or Membership BBQ Day. Members are required to abide by the Club's Constitution, refer to the Club website.

The Club will hold an annual BBQ at a venue for members to attend from 9.00am to 3.00pm on a Sunday in June. This is a casual get together to have a chat, pay your membership for the following year prior to the due date of 1 July.

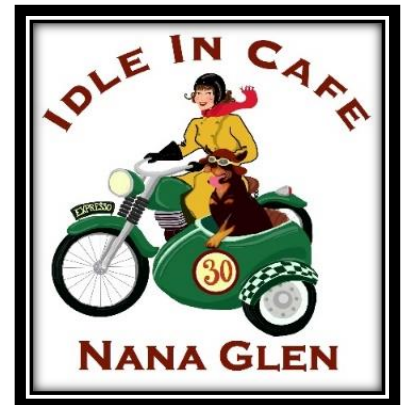

Membership renewal. 2024

The end of the club's financial year is 30th June 2024 Your membership expired on that date. This means you cannot ride a conditionally registered bike after the 30th June unless you have paid your 2024/2025 membership subscription.



As far as the RMS is concerned, if the owner of the vehicle is not financial with his club, then the bike is unregistered, irrespective of when the bike's registration runs out.

Log Book



Who is eligible to use a log book

Getting a log book allows you to use vehicles registered under the Historic Vehicle and Classic Vehicle Schemes for up to 60 days per year for maintenance and personal use, outside of club-organised events. Each day of general use must be recorded in your log book.

You may only opt in for a Classic and Historic Vehicle Log Book if:

- you are a recognised club member with NSW conditional registration.
- your club participates in the log book scheme.

Check the [Historic vehicle clubs list \(PDF 857.58KB\)](#) or the eligibility requirements for the [classic vehicle scheme](#) for participating clubs.

You can view the [Historic and classic vehicles log book and club runs fact sheet \(PDF 119.96KB\)](#) for more information about using the log book.

Using the log book

You can use the log book as soon as it's issued to record the days you use the vehicle for maintenance or personal use.

The number of days allocated depends on the remaining length of conditional registration when the log book is issued.

Days allocated and registration length.

Remaining registration	Number of days vehicle can be used (allocated log book days)
Up to 3 months	15
Over 3 and up to 6 months	30
Over 6 and up to 9 months	45
over 9 months	60

You must carry the log book in the vehicle when it is in use.

When to notify the club of vehicle use

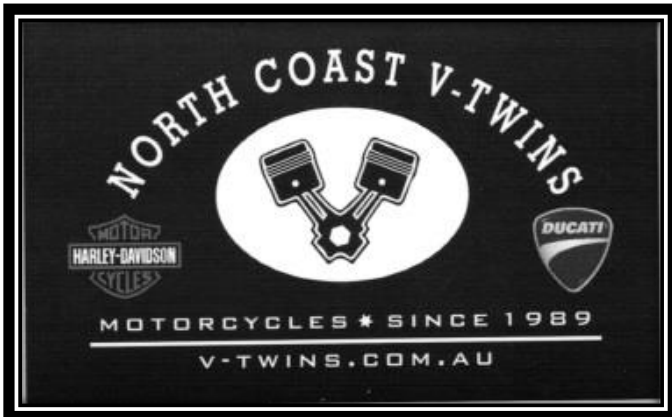
If you're using a log book, you don't need to tell the club which days you are driving the vehicle for personal use or maintenance – unless you have an agreement with the club to notify them.

However, you must record return journeys that are not part of club-organised events and each day of general use in the log book.

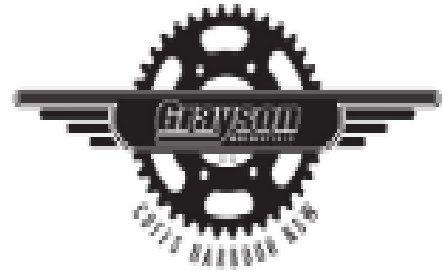

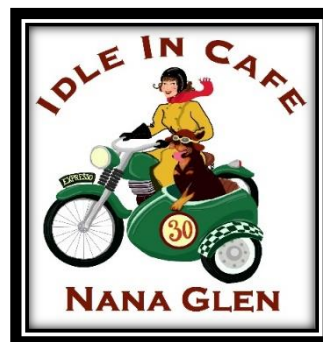

General Business:

Membership Fee Increase:

The proposed membership fee increase was not supported at the meeting as a whole. There was discussion about the fees, whether they are increased or not. Lance has suggested that fees should not be increased. Members have asked the Committee providing an indication of what it costs to run the club each year. This will be prepared and tabled at the next meeting. This NOT be a breakdown of every dollar the club has spent, however figures will be provided. To any members who would like a full breakdown, please contact the secretary.

Lance had contacted other clubs in the area who advised their fees were lower than ours, some were charging \$20.00 per year, some \$30.00 per year. These clubs are much smaller in number and do not provide the benefits that our club does by having as many club rides per week as we do. There are also some clubs that ask rally entrants to assist in the running of the rally, as they don't have the member numbers to do this themselves. Fortunately, we are not in that position and are able to cater for our members and guests who attend our rally.

Mark Herfoss mentioned there are also Clubs on the other end of the scale where Goulburn Club pay \$165.00 a year.

It was also suggested that the Club is not operating under the guidelines of Department of Fair Trading. This will be looked into and reported at the next Club meeting.

Lance proposed a motion to hold voting on this for two months until the information has been forwarded in relation to the running costs of the club – Lance has not checked with the Department of Fair Trade himself, but has been told by a member of another club. This motion was denied as it could not be dealt with until the original motion has been voted on.

Nick has spoken as well in relation to a number of member benefits per member which are available to members who are participating in club events. If a member attended Club events there is well over \$100 worth of benefits to that member for participating. We have the benefit of the use of the club without having to pay room hire, however, if this changes in the future, we might need to pay for this.

Members voting as to whether to increase the membership fees up by \$10.00 per year. The majority of members agreed that membership fees be increased effective for memberships due 1 July 2024.

As there was a lot of discussion of whether the club is adhering to the Constitution, we will spend some time each meeting refreshing members on the Constitution.

Membership Officer – to change the constitution to include membership officer as a separate position for the committee. This was unanimously voted in favour. The amendment was made some years ago prior to Covid, however, the constitution had not been changed reflecting this. The constitution will be amended and submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for public record.

Who Can Ride a Club Bike – Driving a Vehicle Registered Under the HVS. Any person who is the holder of the appropriate licence can legally drive/ride a conditionally registered vehicle. They DO NOT have to be the operator/owner and they DO NOT have to be a member of a recognized Historic Vehicle Club. However, keep in mind, that if you are **NOT** a member of our Club, you do not qualify for the member benefits of our club.

Concourse de Elegance – This will be held at the Botanical Gardens on Saturday 10th August 2024 – further details will be provided as the event is organized.

Member Spotlight – Gavin Gill – DGR ride, raise awareness of mens health, it is a worldwide event, 21st May, 9000 riders in 150 cities and 5 countries in the world. Coffs is now holding this event, with our club supporting this event as one of our calendar rides.

Constitution – This has now been updated and submitted to Department of Fair Trading with the Membership Officer position separated from the Secretary position. Some obsolete paragraphs removed as well as some typo's corrected.

- Lance Gilbert brought our attention to the Constitution and whether our Club was abiding by the guidelines, rules and regulations set by the Department of Fair Trading. After many hours on the phone, we are mostly compliant with the Department of Fair Trading. Some items needed to be updated and submitted:
 - i. Public Officer – a mistake was made where the Public Officer had been allocated to the incorrect Club. This has now been rectified.
 - ii. Financials – reports must be submitted to the Department of Fair Trading within 28 days of the Annual AGM. We were a few years behind in this reporting, we have a few to be submitted and penalties paid.

When having a further look at the constitution, we need to take a look at the membership section. The process needs to be followed where a new member submits their application at a club meeting. At the following meeting a vote will be taken to either accept or reject the application. The applicant is then advised in writing prior to the following months meeting as to whether they have been accepted or not.

The other point of interest is under 13. Conditional Registration (k) Any Club Member who owns a vehicle on conditional registration and who, unless authorised by the Committee, does not utilize that conditional registration to engage in Club organized events, or who otherwise appears to have little or no interest in engaging or taking part in Club events or activities, may be considered by the Committee to be acting prejudicial to, or not in the best interest of the Club, it's other members or the image of motorcycling.

The question this raises, is how far do we go to follow the rules under the constitution. As rightly pointed out by Lance, we must follow the constitution to be a complaint club, do we look at each member who is not actively involved in the Club and remove them?

A general discussion about the Constitution was undertaken, with many members agreeing that the Constitution needs to be completely updated, as there are sections on which the Club had previously voted on changing but has not yet been reflected.

It was decided to include a complete update of the Constitution at the AGM Meeting held in August 2024 – **Notice is hereby given.**

A drop from the Council of Heritage Motor Clubs to keep you going

June 4 2024

- Vehicles travelling in convoy on highways well below the posted speed limit should allow enough distance between vehicles to allow a semi-trailer to overtake safely. At 70km /hour this equates to about 10 car spaces in good weather, more if road is wet.
- Taxation...Some clubs have received letters from the ATO requesting them to self-assess their income tax status. Although “not for profit”, car clubs have not been granted “Tax Exempt” status. CHMC is NOT a registered tax agent, and we recommend that clubs seek professional advice before self-assessing.
- Mobile phone detection cameras can now detect instances where seat belts are not being worn. These cameras are not speed cameras. When seat belts are fitted to a vehicle (regardless of the age of the vehicle) they must be worn. Before a fine is issued images are viewed 3 times by an actual person. 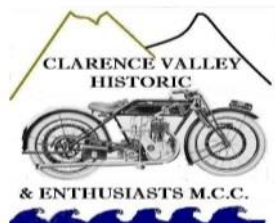

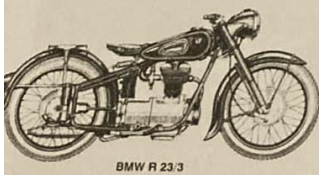
