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

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Out and About

Henty BMWs

The Earls Fork Gathering – 3rd-5th March, 2023.

This event was organized by Henning Jorgansen through the BMWTCNSW and was essentially for BMWs from 1955 to 1968 with Earls Fork front ends. However other makes, such as Douglas, would have been welcome. The venue was Henty, a small town in the eastern Riverina, about 50kms south of Wagga Wagga.



The Coffs Restorers entered 6 bikes. Lance, R60, Kevin R90 hybrid, Holger, John & Jack on R69S's & Rob on R26. Lance would lead the group on one of his scenic tours to the rally. They were joined by Brad Wiseman on his R60. My R26 not being in the same class as the others would go to Henty in my van. I didn't join the scenic tour group. My co-driver, Dave, and I took a direct route to Henty. The scenic tourers took 3 days to reach Henty. They stayed in a horrible hotel in Molong and a better one in Cootamundra, and at various times various members got lost en-route. But none the less they had a good time. You'll have to ask them for details. My route to Henty took me via Bylong valley, and while there an Earls Fork BMW followed by 3 moderns passed. About 20kms on, we came across the BMW and rider down on far side of a slippery ford. His mates & two



cars were there so I only stopped long enough to get his name to pass on to Henning, as this bloke wasn't going to be at the rally. We later learned that he had a couple of fractured ribs.

We were all domiciled together in Trudy's B & B at Henty, an old hotel. The facilities were more or less as they would have been when pub operated in 1960's, and as we were on bikes of the same era, so I suppose this was appropriate. Our upstairs rooms led out to an open veranda that these old pubs have, and we spent much of our leisure time there.

Once settled in, I took my R26 to the servo and refuelled. On return, the R26 started coughing & spluttering and eventually expired. It wouldn't re-start, so I proceeded to push back to Trudy's. During a rest stop a chap, (Charlie), came from a nearby house to see if I needed help. We soon found problem, contaminated fuel! Drained carby & this got me to Trudy's, just! Another draining and I hoped this would be enough to get me on road tomorrow.

The Saturday ride was a triangular route, about 120kms, with a viewing stop at Morgan's lookout and lunch at the Walbundarie hotel. My R26 didn't even get near the start point. I thought I'd be



following riders in my van, but Lance said to keep draining, the tank till fuel looked clear, so I did this with the tap on normal until it was clear. On reserve it was horrible. The R26 fired up and I joined the ride. Also joining us was the Reverend Steve Davis on a BMW, but not an Earls Fork model, with 2 mates on Royal Enfields.

There were about 30 entries, but only 13 were Earls Fork models, and Coffs had 6 of them, and 7 if Brad Wiseman is counted with us. The route was mainly flat till nearing Morgan's Lookout where it became undulating. A 1km dirt detour led to Morgan's Lookout, steep at the finish, and this was R26's undoing. I had to walk the last 200 meters but it



was well worth it. Another carby draining got me going and on to lunch at the Walbunderie pub. Here the legendary Pudding was produced. If you're not into BMWs it may not mean much, but the pudding started its travels over 30 years ago in W.A. Exclusively by motor cycle, and initially by BMW club members, it has traversed the Aussie continent many times. Kev Barber and I have both been Pudding carriers.

After another carby draining, the R26 and I set off for Henty. It ran really well, which was just as well, for most of this section was into a headwind. I feared having to go onto reserve as that would've brought R26 to a spluttering halt, but by luck, I wasn't forced to take this option.

A presentation dinner was held at Henty's Doodle Cooma hotel and Coffs members were recipients of some of the Quirky Bent Fork awards.

The local mayor gave an interesting and entertaining yarn about Henty and his life growing up there.

The meal was good too. Even Lance waxed lyrical about his pork meal, something he normally wouldn't eat.

The return trip home to Coffs Harbour was a straight forward drive for Dave & I, but Lance and his entourage meandered hither and yon. He led them onto a dirt road which didn't impress some! But they returned to Coffs hale, hearty and happy.

Member Spotlight

Geoff Newton, Club Registrar – RMS Requirements for Registration of Historic Motorcycle –

Geoff mentioned that there are a few key points. All machine testers are listed on the newsletter, if you want to see if your bike is eligible for historic registration please go and look at TNSW website. One thing the inspectors get excited about is the modifications to bikes. On the website is a list of mods that can be done as to original. There are bikes that are built by someone else and not the manufacturer. If they were originally registered in the first place, then they are eligible for registration, that would pass any test TNSW is likely to throw at us.

When inspectors are sending back their pink sheets, your membership number needs to be recorded on the pink sheet. You need to be a paid member to be eligible for club registration.

Log books are to be completed only if you are riding the bike not on club rides. You need to go to the RMS to register your bike. You need to provide your membership card to RMS as well when you are registering the machine.

Inspectors have the right to refuse any bike which is not up to standard.

The bikes are registered to be used on the road and should comply with all road regulations.

The reason the forms are required for the bike to be registered is a compliance issue for the Club to record the vehicles we have registered through our Club. We also need this for our association cover.

Lance mentioned that most people behave accordingly, and bikes are mostly registerable.

There are two types of bikes, historic and classic. Our Club only registers Historic vehicles, not classic.

If the vehicle complies with RMS regulations, then it can be registered historically.

Members be careful when buying bikes interstate, you need an originally signed receipt, not an emailed receipt, you need the original to register your machine.

Rally Report:

- Category signs need to be taken to Dorriggo for the display at Dorriggo School

There is a letter the Club has that you are able to give to the sponsor as a part of our request

Well worth the trip and overnight stay.



Fuel:

- The nearest fuel is at Vignes Independent Service Station at 28 Sawtell Road (on the corner of Barber Close) on the way to Coffs Harbour.
- To the South, the nearest fuel is at the Liberty Service Station, 6kms away on Pine Creek Way.
- All rides will pass a service station within 6 kms of the Big 4 Sawtell Caravan Park.
